Pax Christi International's 70th anniversary celebrations begin in Bethlehem

Bethlehem, 13 May 2015 - The Pax Christi International 70th anniversary celebrations "<u>Pilgrims on the Path to Peace (https://paxchristi2015.files.wordpress.com</u> /<u>2014/11/wa-2015-agenda.pdf</u>)" started tonight in Bethlehem, Palestine, in the presence of more than 150 delegates from 30 countries, local people, including political and religious leaders, and Pax Christi partners.

In celebrating our 70th anniversary in one of the most challenging regions in the world, we want to *encourage peace* and *promote hope*. Real *peace* is what we aspire and *hope* is one of our deepest values. It makes us what we are, courageous peacemakers, connected across regions and continents, who address complex violence through nonviolence and promote truth and reconciliation in our local communities.

We will look back a bit to retell our story - our stories - about 70 years of working for peace and reconciliation. This has always been a challenging journey - from the first gestures of reconciliation following the Second World War to the most recent efforts to accompany communities threatened by extremist violence in Syria and Iraq.

Over the next days, the programme will first look at the concrete situation on the ground and see the local reality of life in Palestine, and then - in a set of 'deepening discussion groups'- we will go beyond this local Palestinian reality and connect with global peace issues, closely related to the mission of Pax Christi. The Peace fair and the <u>Peace Award celebration (http://www.paxchristi.net/news/pax-christi-international-peace-award-2015/4293#sthash.BryDEXz4.jYViA8bM.dpbs</u>) on Saturday will mark in a special way our 70th birthday and the final celebration on Sunday will send us off as pilgrims on a renewed journey as peacemakers.
